About the School

In subsequent years, we will add grades 10-12, enabling development of well-rounded graduates prepared for college studies, movement into trades, or pursuit of other paths, as desired by the student.

Position Overview

We are seeking a founding teacher to teach both history and literature to students in grades 7–9. These grades cover western civilization from BC-AD400, 400-1600, and 1600-1850, respectively. The corresponding literature would be, for example: Iliad/ Odyssey/ Vergil/ Plutarch ..., then St. Augustine/ Beowulf/ Canterbury/ Machiavelli/ Shakespeare ..., then Quixote / Bunyan / Milton / Paine / Tocqueville / Cooper ...

This role is ideal for an educator who values depth over scale, enjoys teaching across disciplines, and wants to help shape a new school from the ground up. We anticipate small class sizes, will enable teacher autonomy in developing / adjusting course plans, and will encourage strong connections with students.

You must acknowledge that each student is a child of God, with unique capabilities and shortcomings. Your role is to allow them to recognize these as they progress, such that they deservedly grow in self-confidence through the year.
